What to expect: Virtual musicals are a little bit different than live performances. In a virtual situation, not all students will sing or have lines BUT every student will be able to participate as background characters, dancers or scenery helpers. This fun patriotic show explores the origin, nature, and significance of many of the primary symbols of the United States including the Statue of Liberty, our national flag, the bald

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eagle, Mt. Rushmore, the White House, the Washington Monument, and the memorials to important individuals and events in U.S. history.

Virtual musical productions are a little bit different than live performances. In a virtual situation, students who love the production aspect, but do not enjoy the creative aspect, will help develop background & costume concepts. Production students will not need to attend every week. Musical artists will be required to attend weekly for check in but will not always need to stay for the entire club time.
