The True North Investors Club provides an introduction to the basics of investing. Students will learn about savings, investing, mutual funds, the stock market, ETF's, dividend stocks, value investing, segment investing, growth stocks, dollar-cost averaging, saving, generosity and stewardship. What's Expected: Students are expected to prepare for class by reading a few chapters from each of the two books, as well as answer a few questions in advance of each class. Each student should set aside approximately one hour each week preparing for the class discussion. Because this is a highly collaborative learning environment students are highly encouraged to come to the class prepared and ready to dialogue about the subjects. The club is designed for beginners who are brand new to the concepts of investing. This is for beginners and will be a lot of fun! Stock Market Simulation: Included in the True North Investing Club is an opportunity to participate in a virtual stock market simulation that allows students to practice their stock market investing skills without using real money. Each student will invest a pretend \$100,000 and the student who has increased the value of their portfolio the most at the end of the course will receive a \$50 gift card from Mr. Harkey.
